# **Our Mission**



# The Division of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion

In August of 2019, Pace University hired their first ever Chief Diversity Officer, Tiffany Hamilton. With the addition of Tiffany came the creation of the Division of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion. This division includes The Chief Diversity Officer, The Office of Multicultural Affairs, The Office of Sexual and Interpersonal Wellness, The Office of Institutional Equity and Title IX Compliance, and The LGBTQA+ Center.



#### **Name**

With the addition of this new division, each department reexamined both their name and mission. After careful consideration, we decided the names LGBTQA Center (NYC) and LGBTQA Center (PLV) simply captures the work we do on both campuses. Because social justice is imbedded in all the work we do for the LGBTQA+ community and a "social justice center" implies larger-scale programming/ services that we simply cannot offer, we felt this change was necessary and helped provide some clarification and an exciting new direction for our branding.

# What's New?

### Leadership

In July of 2019, Emmett Griffith joined the LGBTQA+ Center as the new Associate Director. He served as a Graduate Assistant at the center for two years, and as he neared graduation, students were devastated to possibly see him go. When news broke that he'd be rejoining us in his current position, it felt like a natural and necessary transition. Emmett has brought new life to the center, and has reawakened a passion in countless students at Pace. He has not only changed the center space physically, but he has transformed the environment as a whole, and has made the 9th floor of 41 Park Row the place to be. We are incredibly lucky to have him as our leader at the LGBTQA+ Center, and even luckier to have such a determined advocate on the Pace staff as a whole.



# Leadership

### **Queerleaders**

The Queerleader Program is the LGBTQA & Social Justice Center's student leadership program with a peer education component. Queerleaders attend monthly training focused on LGBTQ+ issues, social justice education and leadership development. They learn the presentation skills and curriculum content necessary to present the Center's educational trainings to the Pace community. Some of these educational trainings are Safe(r) Zone, Trans 101, and About the Center which are presented to students, staff, and faculty upon request and during our open house trainings!

### **Q-Camp**

Q-Camp unites the New York City and Pleasantville campuses at Camp Mariah in Fishkill, NY for a 3 day leadership retreat for LGBTQ+ students. After a busy week, Grad Intern Tasha leads us in Healing Friday. An open group for students to engage in self-care through art, reflection, and conversation. Every Monday SA Alex leads a discussion on a specific LGBTQA+ topic ranging from queer history to current media! Sometimes featuring special guests, and always with plenty of food!

#### **T-TIME**

QTPOC Corner is the newest addition to our weekly line-up! Every Thursday Grad Assistant Sherline leads a closed discussion about intersecting identities for Queer and Trans students of color.

A workshop that provides an overview of the LGBTQA+ Center and the resources, services, and events provided by the center.



### Stand With Me

# **Health and Wellness**



### **HIV/STI Testing**

The LGBTQA+ Center in collaboration with the Office of Sexual and Interpersonal Wellness teamed up with Mount Sinai to offer free HIV/STI testing to Pace's students. **50 students were tested**, and the event will now be held once a semester due to need shown by students.

### **Condom Distribution**

As a part of the Pace's Safer Sex Initiative, the LGBTQA+ Center dispersed internal condoms, external condoms, and lube across to 14 locations across the NYC campus. Supplies were tracked and replenished biweekly by SA Nick (shown with the condoms above!) until the campus was closed due to COVID-19.

# Remote Learning and Leading

### **How the Center Continued during COVID-19**
